Meet at these locations:

March 20... Frankford Ave at the bike path entrance at Ashburner. Short, easy walk. Holmesburg history + geology at creek tide-line.

April 17... Welsh Rd at Winchester Ave. Long walk, rough paths. Quarry district, Rowland Factory, Giant stone blocks.

May 15... Rowland & Rhawn “Crystal Springs”. Mile walk, rough path “Grand Canyon”. Beach comb Sandy Run for rocks, minerals, artifacts (with luck!)

June 19... Pine Rd. parking lot. Native American archaeology, prehistory. Short walk on rough paths.

July 17... Environmental Center parking lot. Native American archaeology, prehistory. Short walk to Native American site.

August 21... Rhawn St at Lexington Ave. Rough path and paved path. Easy walk in tall shady woods.

September 18... Upper Rhawn St parking lot. Easy walk on paved path. Ancient oak. Whale Rock. Beach comb. History Hartel Print Works.

October 16... Tot lot on Verree Rd (at Susquehanna/ Tustin) Long walk, rough paths. Big meadows, tall trees, fall color.

November 20... Winchester Ave. at Roosevelt Blvd. (eastside). Easy mile walk, Pine grove. Axe Factory Run. “Wandering Stones” Geology. Echo Villa site.
